



# 8<sup>th</sup> Youth Forum on SDG Implementation

## Empowering Young People as Digital Innovators to Realize the SDGs

Concept Note  
(6 September 2024)

### Introduction

The world has witnessed a growing number of global movements towards sustainability and environmental consciousness. Young people from across the globe have become more actively engaged in sustainable development and climate action, and their need to be involved and heard have become increasingly urgent.

During the 2024 ECOSOC Youth Forum, the United Nations Secretary-General, Mr. António Guterres, highlighted that “our world is bristling with challenges, tragedies and injustice”<sup>1</sup> which has kept the Sustainable Development Goals way off track. He has outlined that critical consequence of these challenges and emphasised the necessity of involving young individuals to turbocharge the SDGs and reinvigorate multilateralism<sup>2</sup>.

This year, the United Nations Project on Governance (UNPOG), under the Division for Public Institutions and Digital Government (DPIDG) of the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA), in collaboration with the Ministry of the Interior and Safety (MOIS) and Incheon Metropolitan City, with support of the Ministry of Environment of the Republic of Korea, will organise the 8<sup>th</sup> Youth Forum on SDG Implementation on **Empowering Young People as Digital Innovators to Realize the SDGs** to ensure that young people are provided with necessary support and skills to mobilise the advancement of the SDGs, and continuously give them a platform to be heard.

The 8<sup>th</sup> Youth Forum on SDG Implementation will be held **virtually via Zoom** on **6 September 2024 at 13:30 – 17:00 Seoul, GMT+9**. It will continue to include and engage young people from Asia and the Pacific, East Africa and beyond on the discussion of the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and tap their potential to realise the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

### Objectives

The 8<sup>th</sup> Youth Forum on SDG Implementation: *Empowering Young People as Digital Innovators to Realize the SDGs* will aim to bring together youths from Asia and the Pacific, East Africa, and beyond to:

- Engage young people in meaningful discussions and encourage them to share innovative ideas and green solutions to realise the SDGs.
- Develop youth consciousness, creativity, and ability to take responsibility for their actions to promote and achieve the SDGs.
- Provide a platform for young people to be heard and bring innovative ideas and solutions to issues that matter to them.

## **Substantive Scope**

The Summit of the Future calls to include young people in meaningful global decision making<sup>3</sup>. The United Nations Secretary-General, Mr. António Guterres, further stated that while “truly transformative action requires all of us pulling together to drive change”, young people have greater stake in the future and offer more bold solutions<sup>4</sup>.

As youth are the forefront of driving innovation and sustainability, meaningful discussions and engagement with young people are essential to achieve collective action and realise the SDGs. More than ever, advocating for more participation from young people in the decision-making process has become relevant as they have the skills and ability to contribute to the advancement of the society.

To ensure that young people are equipped with essential knowledge as digital innovators and green champions for a sustainable future, the 8<sup>th</sup> Youth Forum on SDG Implementation: *Empowering Young People as Digital Innovators to Realize the SDGs* will aim to cover the topic below.

### **Exploring the Power of Youth in Shaping Digital and Innovative Solutions for the SDGs**

Digital technologies do not exist in a vacuum and has an enormous potential for positive change<sup>5</sup>. For young people, these can be more than just tools but also a gateway to new horizons. It provides youth the opportunity to start new business, explore new opportunities, develop new skills and acquire new knowledge, and build global connections<sup>6</sup>.

The United Nations Secretary-General, Mr. António Guterres, emphasised the need to keep harnessing digital technologies to help deliver the SDGs to build a better world<sup>7</sup>. The rapid advancement of technology, including data governance, artificial intelligence (AI) acceleration, and cybersecurity, provides young people opportunities and empowers them to participate in the decision-making as they bring unique perspectives and capabilities to the conversation on digital innovation.

Growing up in a rapidly changing world, young people are more adaptable to new technologies and ideas. As active and influential users of new technology<sup>8</sup>, youth are natural innovators in finding solutions to today’s challenges. They are considered as the driving force behind digitisation and innovation<sup>9</sup>, and more than ever, recognising and harnessing their potential to shape digital innovation is imperative to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and secure a sustainable future for the next generation.

The 8<sup>th</sup> Youth Forum on SDG Implementation: *Empowering Young People as Digital Innovators to Realize the SDGs* will be held virtually using Zoom to accommodate the young individuals

The Forum will then be followed by presentations from five (5) shortlisted teams of the Ideas for Change Contest. The prospective teams will be given 10 minutes each to deliver ideas to the audience. Announce of the winners will be made before the closing of the Forum.
