Years, or even decades, of progress have been halted or reversed by the pandemic

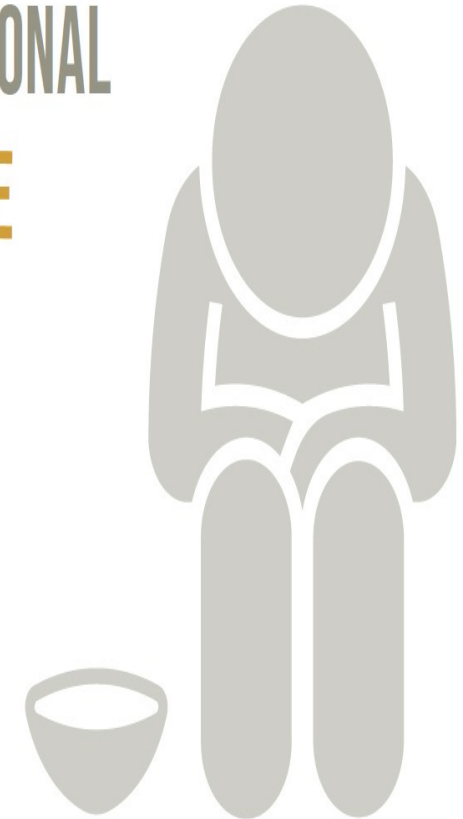

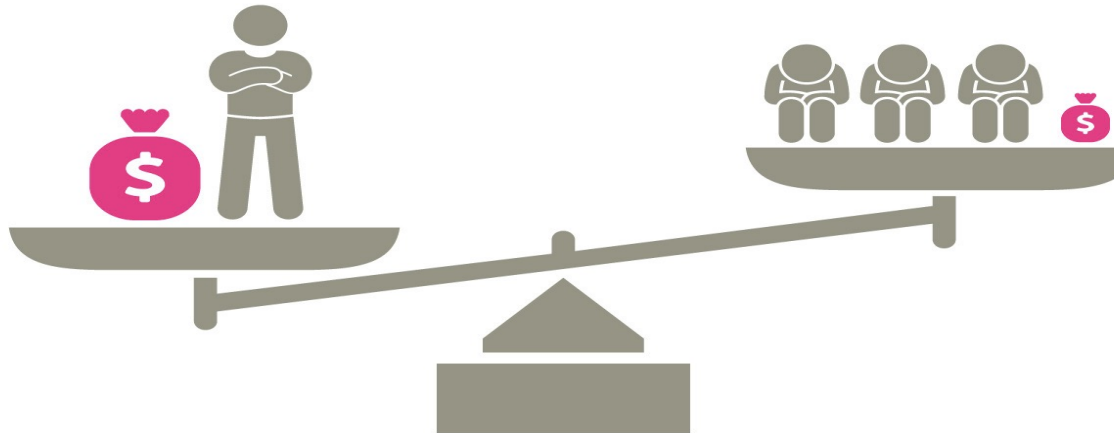

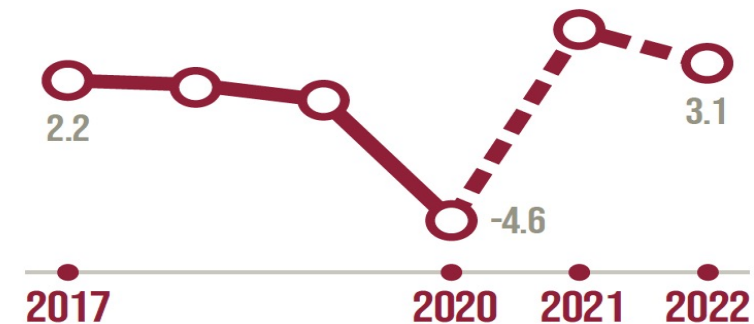
The means of implementation to enact the SDGs have been negatively affected

1. Time for Transformative Change for SDGs

The crisis demonstrates the interdependency and interlinkages among the various dimensions of sustainability – from health, well-being, and social and economic prosperity to climate and ecosystems.

To address the vulnerabilities exposed by the pandemic, Governments should make structural transformations and develop common solutions guided by the SDGs.



1. Time for Transformative Change for SDGs

How to address the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic - Resilience, Adaptability, Innovation

- ① **Emergency measures for shoring up social protection** - Between 1 February and 31 December 2020, Governments worldwide announced more than 1,600 new social protection measures in response to the crisis, but almost all (95 per cent) were short term in nature.
- ② **Embracing digital technologies to deliver accessible, reliable, and inclusive services, especially for vulnerable groups** - including health systems, education, water, sanitation and other basic services
- ③ **Accelerate digital transformation** - Governments and businesses – the pandemic profoundly changing the ways in which we interact, learn and work – digital divide (digital skills and literacy, access and affordability to internet, digital infrastructure)
- ④ **Development of national instruments and strategies for the SDGs** – special bond

How to address the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic - Resilience, Adaptability, Innovation

- ⑤ Increasing investments in science, technology and innovation**
- ⑥ Taking a green-economy approach and investing in clean energy and industry**
- ⑦ Promoting social innovation – Sri Lanka's Citralab, Korea Commonz project**
- ⑧ Investing in data and information infrastructure is critical – data disaggregation and monitoring and reviewing of SDG implementation**

- ✓ Global development agenda - 2030 Agenda & the progress report, AAAA agenda, Sendai Framework – policy coherence, tradeoffs and prioritization, integration between different agreements, and partnership with whole society
- ✓ Climate change and the Paris Agreement – green growth and green jobs, ESG values and principles, renewable energy industries, sustainable production and consumption patterns
- ✓ Migration issues (remittances) – IOM, social problems e.g. Afghanistan crisis
- ✓ Trends of global economy - disruption in global supply chains and reversal of globalization – global inflation, asset market booming to create new inequality
- ✓ The impact of the Fourth Industrial Revolution to developing countries and the rising inequalities within and between countries – AI and other frontier technologies – digital economy/digital new deal and digital transformation



3. How to Prepare Oneself to Better Serve the International Community

a) Awareness of major development issues

- ✓ Public health emergencies and global health partnership - equity in vaccines distribution – especially the developing countries
- ✓ Urbanization and smart cities – data-driven smart city management, reliant on big data and data analytics, frontier technologies like AI and IOT, data privacy
- ✓ Youth unemployment and innovation – leveraging digital technologies and partnership with private sector
- ✓ Gender mainstreaming - gender equality and women's empowerment - UN DESA meeting to mainstream gender equality issues in our products and use data disaggregation
- ✓ Understand development challenges in LDCs, SIDS (sea level rise, climate change), LLDCs and post-conflict countries
